Mr. Schlanger has a B.A. in Political Science from University of Wisconsin, a M.A. in European History from Rutgers

University and an honoree of the National Defense Education Act Fellowship.

Mr. Schlanger been an associate and spoke person of Lyndon LaRouche since

1972. He is also a journalist with the Executive Intelligence Review Magazine and a board member of the Schiller Institute.

He has written on many subjects, especially on economics, from the banking deregulation bills of 1980-2, and the S&L crisis where deregulation spawned, to the Greenspan bubbles, and to the crash of 2008. He wrote numerous articles on the "Enron model" of derivation speculation, and the housing bubble. Since 2009, he has spent time in Europe, where he has participated in numerous seminars in France, Germany, Austria and Italy, speaking on the failure of the Euro and the speculative economy.

In 1990, he ran for the Democratic Party nomination for the U.S. Senate in Texas, receiving nearly 250,000 votes (25%) in the primary election. He has also served as a campaign adviser to Kesha Rogers, who twice won the Democratic nomination for U.S. Congress in the 22nd District of Texas, and is running in 2014 for the U.S. Senate seat in Texas.
